Purpose built for studio-based learning, designed by architects Allies and Morrison, HSoA is the creative heart of Kidderpore Green, Hampstead.

Operating over four floors, the new building comprises open plan fine art studios, a sculpture and ceramics studio, life drawing room, printmaking, silk painting and jewellery making facilities, dedicated studio spaces Foundation Advanced and Course students. It's annex buildings offering professional studios and a carving faculty, library and resources area, plus the beautiful HSoA Gallery, the Glass Gallery, HSoA Cafe and an outdoor piazza.

HSoA was founded in 1946 by a group of local artists, including Henry Moore, Jeannette Jackson and Bernard Gay, who believed that art should not be the exclusive domain of the avant garde. Today the school is an independent centre of artistic excellence, providing first class, affordable tuition in traditional observational and experimental creative skills. Our branding includes the line 'Unleashing the artist in everyone, a direct reference our founders' to original mission.
